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Big night to see

MISSY BERRIMAN, of West Tweed: I hope to be a good mother next year. And we have plans to open a business too.



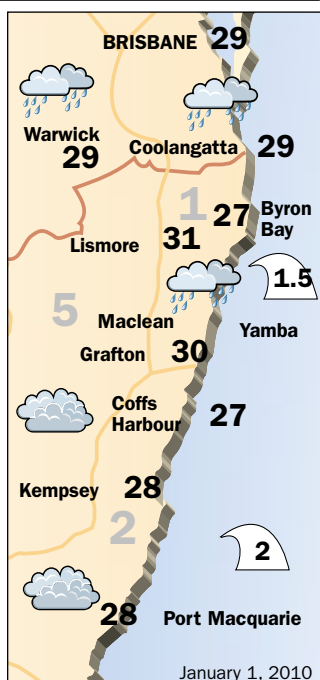
